Year 3 & 4 Curriculum Update

Hummingbirds and Parrots have been really enjoying their work on the Polar Regions in Geography. We have been learning about what it is like in the Arctic Circle and in Antarctica, what different animals live there and how they are able to adapt to the freezing temperatures where they live. In Science, we have learnt about

sounds. We have identified and explained; how sound is made and how it travels. We have used instruments to explore high and low pitch, and we have even created our own string telephones (inspired by Alexander Graham Bell's invention). In English, we have finished our learning based on Shackleton's Journey, that included children writing diary entries and letters as members of the crew. We are now learning about a new text called The Wild Robot. We are continuing reading Charlotte's Web, having lots of discussions about the characters and making predictions and justifying them. In Maths, Year 3 children have been learning about place value and recognising and identifying what each number represents in 3-digit numbers, we have just moved onto addition and subtraction, and we are adding and



subtracting numbers crossing tens boundaries. In Maths, Year 4 children have finished their place value unit; recognising values of 4-digit numbers, effectively partitioning and rounding to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000. They have now started addition and subtraction, and we are currently using column method addition to add 4-digit numbers – with more than one exchange. We are also continuing to develop our times table recall.



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Netball Festival

Mrs Ostler had the pleasure of taking 18 pupils from Year 5 and 6 to The Warriner netball festival on Thursday. The value for the event was teamwork and our two teams really demonstrated this value well: taking turns in rotations, cheering on their team and celebrating good play. As always the children were a credit to the school and really tried their best, many not having played netball before and having to quickly learn the rules and their positions. It was a great afternoon and all the children thoroughly enjoyed the event and the opportunity to play against other schools in our cluster. Well done all.

Yenworthy

The Year 6 students thoroughly enjoyed their trip to Yenworthy last week. We have posted lots of updates and pictures on Facebook and below are just a few comments from our students.

Polar Scientist Talk

We would like to give a big thank you to Miss Arthur's sister, Dr Jenny Arthur, for giving her time to speak to KS2 this week about her life living in the Arctic and her trip to Antarctica. Dr Arthur is a polar scientist who works for the Norwegian Polar Institute in Tromso, Norway and who researches lakes in Antarctica. She told the children about her trip to Antarctica last year and her life in the Arctic circle. The children loved seeing all of the photos and videos and hearing about some of the differences between there and the UK. We are very forutnate to be able to have these opportunities to enrich our curriculum offer and we look forward to hearing from a whale researcher in a few week's time.
