Dear Parents,

It has been great to see everyone make such a positive start to the term. The children have settled well to the new routines of the day, and have shown real enthusiasm for their learning. A reminder that all curriculum overviews that show the areas of learning covered in your child's class are available here

This week in collective worship we have focused on how we can all live together as a school community to make sure we are happy together. We shared how being kind, showing forgiveness and helping each other to work together were good attributes to have as a school. In class, children shared examples of how they make this happen in school each day.

As a school we have introduced a programme called **Corefulness** these are short 4 minutes movement sequences that we use at the beginning of the day and after lunch. Research has shown that developing these skills can have a positive impact of readiness of learning, achievement, behaviour and social development. Look out for more updates as we progress with the programme.

EYFS Curriculum Update

It has been wonderful to see how well our new Nursery and Reception children have settled into their first few weeks in the Aviary. The children have enjoyed exploring the unit and building new relationships with peers and key adults. We have been impressed with their courage and care for each other and the classroom environment. This week we started this terms theme- Ourselves. Our big question is 'Are we all the same?' The children spent time thinking about and looking at our faces, finding similarities and differences in eye, hair and skin colour. The children created their own portraits, and we made faces using different objects. We also learnt some fun songs and rhymes about different body parts.
